RESPECT stands for Respect, Ethics, Strength, Perseverance, Education, Courage and Trustworthiness. The program started in 2014 in response to the needs of the communities in the North County. Parents, probation officers and school counselors recommend middle and high school students to the program. Once a week for three months, students and deputies meet at the Boys and Girls Club of San Marcos. Classes include free meals and sports activities. Guest speakers inspire students to improve their lives by going to college and referring them to job training programs. Deputies also connect the students to social services and employment opportunities.
