In December 2020, an additional 378 individuals were detained. Of those, force was used in 23 cases.

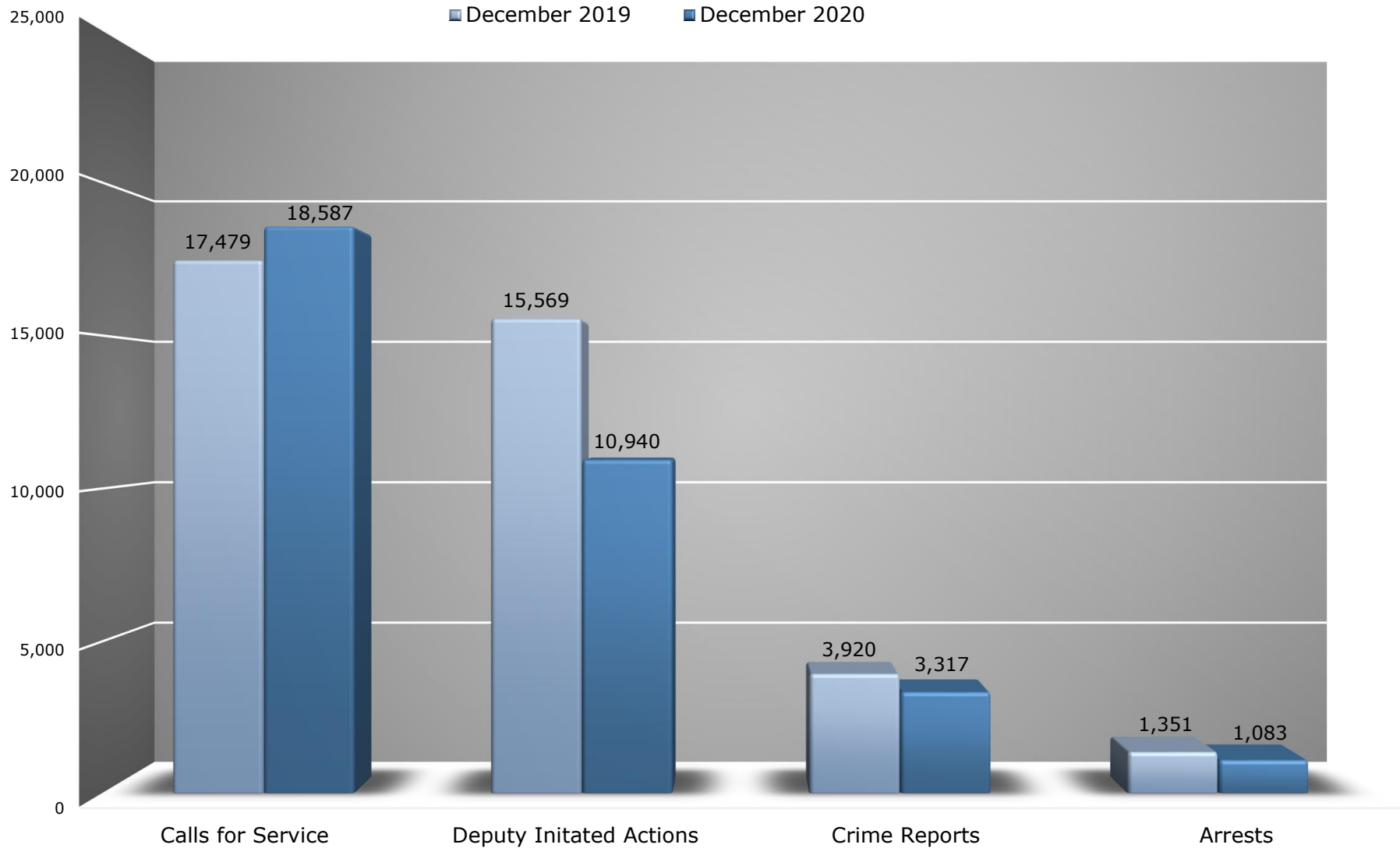

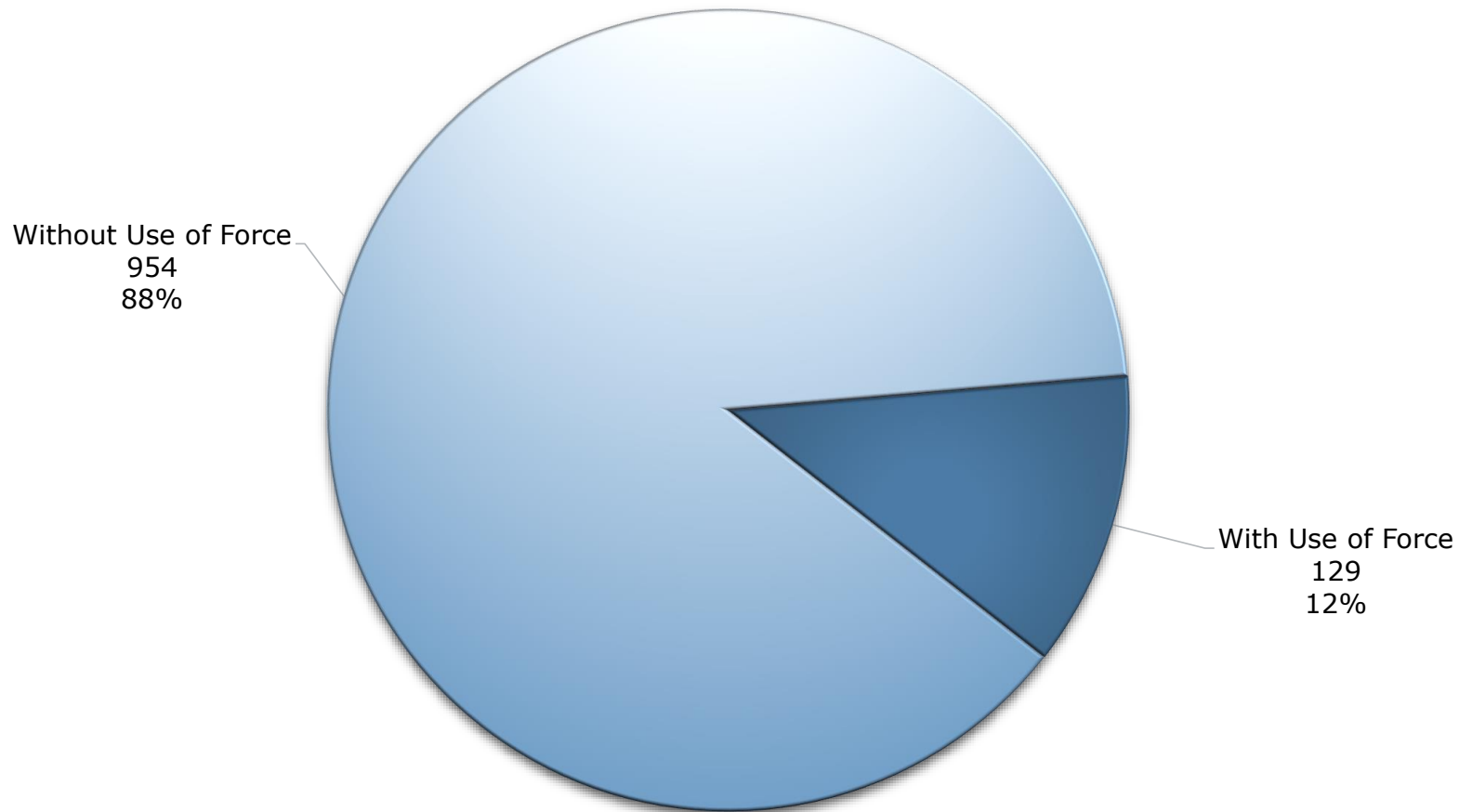
