



Suspected Overdoses with Narcan Deployments- CY 2024 YTD

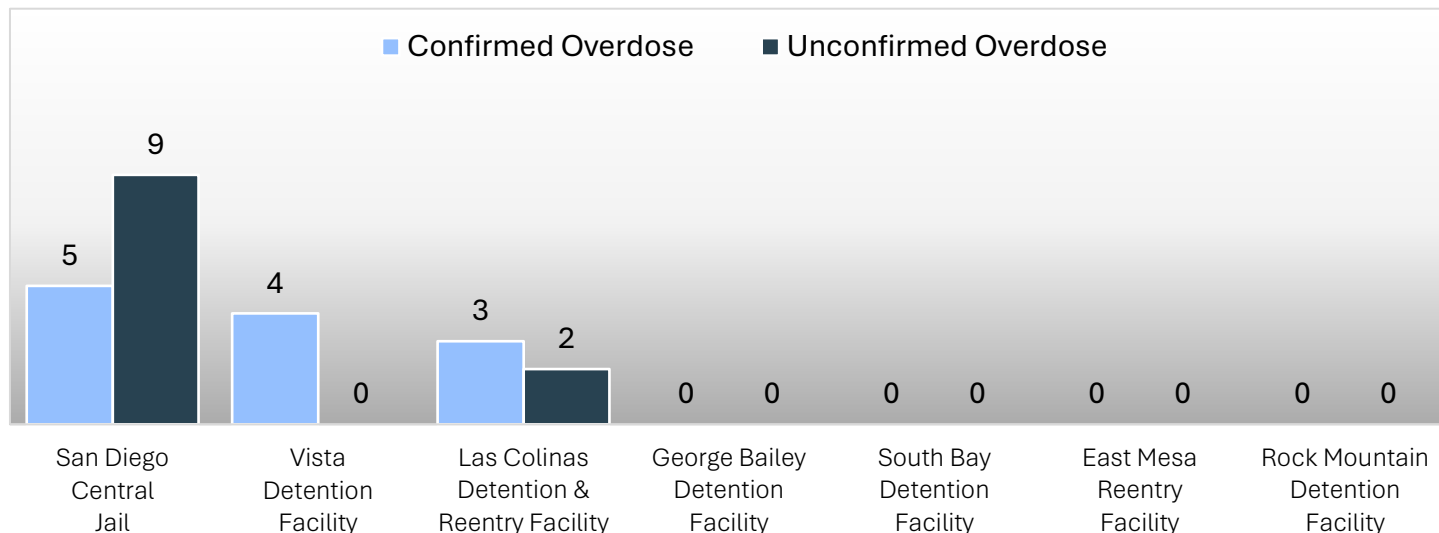
These following figures reflect the number of incarcerated persons that had Narcan administered to them in the jail. Narcan, an opioid antagonist, is a medication that can rapidly reverse the effects of opioids in the body. Per policy, Narcan should be administered to any individual who presents signs of an opioid overdose or when an overdose is suspected.

The incidents displayed in this report were determined, upon medical review, to be a result of or related to a drug overdose based on the primary medical diagnosis presented by the treating emergency room. Incidents of Narcan use that were later determined by the hospital to not be due to an overdose situation (e.g., turned out to be any other medical issue based on the primary diagnosis), are excluded from this report.

An incident is noted as a *Confirmed Overdose* if an overdose diagnosis was provided by the hospital, and a positive drug diagnostic test was verified by San Diego Sheriff medical staff.

An incident is counted as an *Unconfirmed Overdose* if an overdose diagnosis was provided, but a drug diagnostic test either was not conducted by the hospital, the patient refused to be screened, or the results were not provided to Sheriff medical staff to review.
